Macy's Thanks Partners who Helped Make Remodel Possible

Portland, Ore. – Downtown Portland welcomed back an old favorite today with the grand reopening of Macy's at Meier & Frank Square. At this morning's ribbon cutting ceremony, Macy's Northwest President, Robert B.
